Friday 31st March

This term we have been exploring our school value curiosity. Staff have been talking to the children about what it is to be curious and asking and encouraging lots of curious questions “I wonder if ?” and “I wonder why....?”.

We started the term with exploring Children’s Mental Health week. We have been focusing on building positive relationships and exploring the term kind. Staff have been encouraging children to talk about and name different emotions while reading the ‘Colour Monster’ by Anna Llenas and linking discussions to self-regulation. The Nursery



children have been learning calming breathing exercises. This is a great way to help children to learn to self-regulate and tune into how they are feeling. One of these is ‘Finger Breathing’, where we breathe in and out five times whilst tracing around each finger. Others have included ‘Bee Breath’, ‘Square Breathing’ and ‘Balloon Breaths’. In addition to this Reception children have been looking at

identifying different feelings and potential strategies we can use to help us when we are feeling a certain way – physical movement, exercise, breathing, talking to an adult or a friend etc.



Science week was enjoyed by all! A range of wonderful experiments were going on across the school including, magic rainbow clouds, colour experiments, walking water experiments and volcanic explosions. Staff would like to offer a special thanks to all the parents who brought in resources and their time to talk to the children. Mariam came in to talk to us about what it is like to be a doctor. The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring all her resources including her first aid kit, stethoscope, mini torch and model skeleton. Jesper also kindly came in to talk about the brain and showed the children different pictures of the brain. Several parents were kind in bringing items in for us to explore and share including a microscope and miniature model of the solar system. Everyone had lots of fun exploring and experimenting!

The Nursery children had a fantastic time at Oxford City Farm! They learnt about how fruit and vegetables are grown and all about how they are taken care of. They were also lucky enough to get to feed the sheep and chickens and watch Phil make a fire for their hot chocolate!



Children and staff across the school have been enjoying getting outside and exploring the wet and recently slightly sunnier days! They have been enjoying digging, weeding, making bird feeders and exploring the big garden and all it has to offer. Reception children have been starting to plant seeds and talking about the change in seasons and what happens in Spring.
