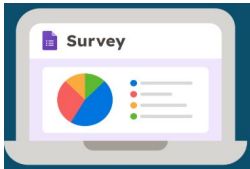

Baking with Tracey

Try Tracey's seasonal chocolate crispy cake recipe and bake along at home!

All you'll need is 200g of melted chocolate (Tracey recommends mixing white/milk/dark chocolates together), 85g of shredded wheat, cornflakes or rice crispies. Cupcake cases.

Top tip: You can add a little Butter and golden syrup to pull the mixture together.

Don't forget decorative eggs or miniature chicks for a fun finish

Step 1

Melt the chocolate in a small bowl placed over a pan of barely simmering water. Pour the chocolate over the cereal and stir well to combine.

Step 2

Spoon the chocolate mixture into cupcake cases and press the back of a teaspoon in the centre to create a nest shape.

Step 3

Place a chocolate egg (child safe) on top, or decorate with small chicks for plenty of fun. Chill the nests in the fridge for 2 hrs until set.
